LWR In Action

The ELCW Spring Gathering and SWMN Synodical Convention of the Women of the ELCA are now in the past.

The theme of the Gathering was "Mission: More than Quilts." The theme verse was Matthew 5:16 - "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven."

Lisa Bonds, the Vice President of Human Relations for Lutheran World Relief, was the speaker at the Gathering. She is originally from Litchfield, MN and now lives and works in Baltimore, MD. She is so enthusiastic about the work of LWR and her role in it. She travels the world and sees LWR in action. LWR is referred to as "the calloused hands of the church." They are known as the ones who DO the work of the church.

There are three aspects of the work of LWR. They are advocacy, development and relief work. Advocacy and development both entail working with those in need to find answers for their betterment. Perhaps helping establish sources for clean water or sharing ideas on increasing food production can help others develop their own resources. Advocacy is practiced in helping workers get fair prices for their product and their labor or perhaps to work for the opportunity for girls to get an education.

Best known to us is the relief work of LWR. In 2007 1,494 tons of quilts and kits worth more than \$14 million were distributed in 23 countries around the world. Almost 500,000 quilts were given out in 2007! Thailand received the most with 75,000, followed by Ukraine with 45,000. A complete listing of where all the quilts and kits went last year is posted on the women's section of the bulletin board in the hallway. Also listed is the Partner Agency that worked with LWR to disperse the items.

LWR has only two warehouses in the United States - one in St. Paul and one in Maryland. These warehouses can empty out so fast; the need is ongoing and urgent at this time.

In her travels, Lisa has seen the difference these quilts and kits make to those in need. It is the reward she reaps from having "the best job ever!"

The Natwick Epistle

I like stories, and I ran across one that I wanted to pass on to you that's about play...

On the first day of school at the college I attended, our professor challenged us to get to know someone we didn't know. A gentle hand touched my shoulder and I turned around to find a wrinkled, little old lady beaming up at me with a smile that lit her entire being.

"Hi handsome! My name is Rose. I'm eighty-seven years old. Can I give you a hug?"

I laughed responded, "Of course you may!" and she gave me a giant squeeze.

After class we walked to the student union building and shared a chocolate milk shake. Every day, for the next three months, we would leave class together and talk nonstop. Over the course of the year, Rose became a campus icon and she easily made friends wherever she went. She loved to dress up and she reveled in the attention bestowed upon her from the other students. She was living it up. At the end of the semester we invited her to speak at our football banquet, and I'll never forget what she taught us.

Rose was introduced, stepped up to the podium, and dropped her three by five cards on the floor. Frustrated and a little embarrassed she said, "I'm sorry I'm so jittery. I'll never get my speech back in order so let me just tell you what I know."

As we laughed she cleared her throat and began: "We do not stop playing because we are old; we grow old because we stop playing. You have to laugh and find humor every day. You've got to have a dream. When you lose your dreams, you die. We have so many people walking around who are dead and don't even know it! There is a huge difference between growing older and growing up. If you are nineteen years old and lie in bed for one full year and don't do one productive thing, you will turn twenty years old. If I am eighty-seven years old and stay in bed for a year and never do anything I will turn eighty-eight. Anybody can grow older. That doesn't take any talent or ability. The idea is to grow up by always finding the opportunity in change. Have no regrets. The elderly usually don't have regrets for what we did, but rather for things we did not do. The only people who fear death are those with regrets."

At the year's end Rose finished the college degree she had begun all those years ago.

One week after graduation Rose died peacefully in her sleep.

Letter from our Missionaries

This is an email received from our Trinity sponsored missionaries on April 21, 2008. This letter was read at all the worship services presented by our youth as part of their 30 Hour Famine event. It is a direct tie to the current "Global Food Crisis." Pastor Joyce and Ian continue to keep us informed of the growing need of the people of the Central African Republic. Since this letter arrived, we have heard of the disasters in Myanmar and China and in our own country. The need is great!

No bread. No cake. No cookies. No crackers. No pretzels. No potato pancakes and no scalloped potatoes (though we have plenty of potatoes at this moment). No cheese or white sauces. Nothing that contains flour.

It this to treat a food allergy or is it a new diet?

Neither. It's called the "Global Food Crisis" and it's become a reality for us in the Central African Republic. We cannot buy any flour. It has been one week now and there is no flour anywhere in town for sale and the merchants have no idea when they will have flour again. But when they do, the price is most certainly going to be higher. When and how much higher remain the questions to be answered.

Ian and I have heard of the recent protests in Haiti, in Egypt and in West Africa, including Burkina Faso, Senegal and Cameroon (which is next door to us) because of rising food prices. We've not heard of any protests here in the Central African Republic and because of poor infrastructure and communication, it is likely that few Central Africans are aware that the present shortage being experienced here is not unique.

Another "real life example" from us of the Global Food Crisis: up until very recently it was not unusual for 21 or 22 cattle to be killed daily in Bouar and the beef would be sold in the market. IN the last few weeks, however, the number killed has dwindled to 1 or 2 per day. The population, however, has not dwindled, so the demand has not changed. The price - not surprisingly - has skyrocketed.

Remember that the Central African Republic is a land-locked country. In this Global Food Crisis, it will be the countries with sea ports who will first be receiving the much need basic food supplies. We can only hope that some will trickle through and they will do so sooner rather than later. Because basic food supplies here are a matter of life and death.
