Someone once told me that one shouldn't go into ordained ministry unless one simply can't do anything else. In other words, if there's any way out, take it. As for me, it's been more primarily a sense of joy in this vocation and a sense of confidence that God has enabled me with the gifts to do this work and that I could accept this calling and still be "me". I have steadfastly (stubbornly) resisted the church's efforts to make "me" fit any "mold" even if the "me" wasn't particularly likeable or congenial. Sometimes I've tried so hard that I've gone well over the edge. I find comfort in reading my New Testament and discovering that Jesus called some whom we'd likely consider "undesirable". By any objective measurement, we'd likely have to consider even Jesus' closest disciples "mediocre" at best. But God sealed the deal!

So with all the "ups and downs" and there have been many over the years, I still wouldn't and perhaps couldn't do anything else. I am confident in the God who brings into being what is not and who raised Jesus Christ from the dead; the God who named me and claimed me, and the God who daily puts to death the old and raises up the new. And I am confident that this God will bring things to God's appropriate end in the sense both of finish and purpose/conclusion.

I have often teased my family that they know the epitaph on my tomb should read "Here lies a real S.O.B." but I think now on my better days that it should be what I chose as the theme for my ordination service 35 years ago, and what I deeply hope has been an undergirding theme of my life: "May Jesus Christ be Praised!" God grant you and me to live to that end.

In Review

As Women of the ELCA we have reached the mid point in our year. When we look back we celebrate hosting a great afternoon tea and sponsoring a bus trip to Owatonna.

The books written by our speaker for the tea and by our host at the orphanage are now in the Trinity Church Library. Dee Dee Raap wrote Dear Mom, Remembering, Celebrating, Healing. We get to know her and her mom in this inspiring, beautifully written book. The relationship between mothers and daughters is brought to us and leads us to look at our own relationships.

A Boy from C-11, Case #9614 is written as a memoir by Harvey Ronglien. In it he tells his story of being a boy in the State Public School in Owatonna for eleven years, from age four until fifteen. Each child who was a resident there has his own story to tell. For some it was a "circle of hell, for others a safe haven." He writes of both the positive things and the negative that made up his life.

Lutheran World Relief Project

The Mission Action Committee has chosen to do layettes as their project for the next six months. We ask the help of all Trinity members in collecting items for these LWR layettes. Many babies in the US and around the world, because of disasters or poverty, begin their lives without even a shirt on their little backs. In hospitals here and abroad, in refugee camps, and in villages around the world, LWR layettes provide a warm welcome to newborns and their mothers. Please help us fulfill this need. The following items are included in each layette:

- 2 shirts or onesies (or similar item)
- 2 gowns or sleepers
- 2 receiving blankets
- 4 cloth diapers
- 1 sweater
- 2 washcloths
- 1 bath-size bar of gentle soap, in its wrapping
- 2 diaper pins

Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Consider varying the sizes of the clothing items so the layettes will continue to be useful as the baby grows. Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from left over yarn or sewn from leftover double knits. Infant sweatshirts may be substituted for the sweater.

A bolt of flannel can furnish a number of receiving blankets, diapers and gowns. A square cut the width of the fabric (usually 26" or 45") easily makes a blanket. Diapers can be made by using pinking shears to cut 22.5" x 36". Please make diapers of TWO LAYERS of flannel. Use care when making diapers and blankets from flannel. It may be necessary to zigzag edges or sew a hem to prevent unraveling.

Items may be placed in the box provided in the narthex. If you would rather give a cash donation, we will be happy to purchase the items needed.

Habitat 500 Update

With only 2 weeks remaining before the start, Julie Fedeler is completing her training for the Habitat 500, a 7 day, 500 mile bike tour to raise awareness of and funds for Habitat for Humanity! She has ridden approximately 1,000 training miles and only has another 150 to 200 miles of training to do before July 13th when the ride will start in Monticello and wind it's way through Hutchinson, New London, Little Falls, Onamia and Foley before returning to Monticello. Julie's goal is to raise \$5,500. 90% of funds raised will go to the St. Peter Chapter of Habitat for Humanity as they work to build house #18 this summer. 10% of the funds will go to the 3rd Bike Home, which will be built in Onamia. Giver or Steward?

Some time ago I heard a pastor give a presentation in which he asked two questions worthy of our attention.

- 1) How much of what is mine should I give to God?
- 2) How much of what is God's should I keep and use for myself?

Question number 1 is a "giver's question". It sounds religious and the asker may indeed respond with generosity. We are surely grateful for the "giver's question" and those who answer it with lives of generous giving.

A biblical understanding of stewardship, and forthright honesty, compel us, however, to face the fact that the "giver's question" is still the wrong question, and that "givers" giving is not true Christian stewardship. The steward asks, "How much of what is God's should I use and keep for myself?" That question puts all in proper perspective. Because we really don't own anything! It is all God's! "The cosmos is the Lord's and all that is in it; the world and those who live in it" (Psalm 24.1) ALL that we are tempted to say in mine, mine, mine! Genuine stewards live and give as we sing:

*We give thee but thine own,
What'er the gift may be;
All that we have is thine alone,
A trust, O Lord, from thee.*

*Praise God from whom all blessings flow,
Praise God all creatures here below,
Praise God above you heavenly hosts,
Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost!*

The planning committee, chaired by Kris Kelly, did an excellent job in planning and carrying out this assembly. Everything moved very smoothly and we all felt comfortable and very well hosted.

We gathered to worship, learn, decide on church policy, and had fellowship with God's people across SW Minnesota. Over 600 worshippers gathered in Christ Chapel for our opening and closing worship services. Bishop Jon Anderson brought the message for our opening worship and Bishop Louis Sibiya of South Africa addressed the closing worship.

The three part Bible Study, led by Rev. Dr. Craig Nesson from Watrburg Theological Seminary was a highlight of this assembly. We are challenged to look at our church and our mission in the world we live in today. Our opportunities for learning were the workshop times. On Saturday afternoon we could attend the workshops, choosing from a total of fifteen. At noon we broke into groups to eat our bag lunches by choosing one of ten learning options. During our business sessions, the five resolutions before the assembly were discussed and favorably passed.

The feeling of celebration was in the air at our evening dinners. Anniversaries of pastors years of service were recognized and pastors new to the synod were welcomed. The 20th anniversary of the ELCA was celebrated at the banquet on Saturday. Past synod ministers and bishops shared humorous and touching stories of their time in service at the synod level.

We came to worship, learn, set policy and for fellowship with others in our SW MN Synod. All of these were accomplished. We feel privileged to have been a part of this assembly.

Great Summer Recipes

Rhubarb Pie

Put cut-up rhubarb in bottom pie shell. Sprinkle with flour and sugar mixture. Pour cream on top. Place top crust on pie. Bake at 375° for 40 minutes.

1 pound fresh asparagus, washed and break off tough ends. Cut into 2 inch pieces. Place in medium casserole, sprinkle with 2 tbsp of olive oil, toss so all is covered by the oil. Cover and bake at 375° for about 10 minutes or until you smell the aroma!
