





Lenten Soup Suppers


The Trinity Women (WELCA) will be organizing soup suppers on Wednesday nights during Lent. Serving will begin at 5:30 pm.

FEBRUARY (blues) NEWS

I don't know about any of you, but the month of February (at least to me) has always seemed like a "blue" month. Blue - as in the cold, lifeless and colorless landscape. Blue - as in bringing our levels of excitement way down and our thoughts about wanting to go somewhere – anywhere but here - way up. I think it is the month when more people want to leave this part of the country (even if only for a few days) more than at any other time. I will admit that this is the month of the year that I least look forward to and is one that I hope departs quickly. Maybe that is why people long ago gave it only 28 days (at least three out of every four years) before moving on to the month of March!

But there is something that I do look forward to each February – IT MEANS THAT THE BEGINNING OF THE SEASON OF LENT IS NOT FAR AWAY! Now please know I love all the other liturgical seasons, but the season of Lent is the season that is always the most emotional and meaningful to me.

Good Environmental News is Always Welcome!

There are scientific breakthroughs coming from the U of MN and across the pond from Denmark. They both are working on ways to get reusable fibers from discarded clothes. Danish scientists tackled the workout items we love because the elastic material, elastane, allows the fabric to stretch and adapt to our bodies. But when it's mixed with other fibers, the clothes are almost impossible to recycle. According to the journal, Green Chemistry, the new method can remove elastane from the nylon to allow recycling of the nylon fibers. They are now working on how to separate elastane from cotton fibers.

At the Duluth campus, grad students have worked with associate professor Abbie Clarke-Sather to create a Fiber Shredder. Unlike similar machines already on the market that cut fibers, the Shredder pulls fibers apart, which keeps them longer in length and makes it easier to resin them back into yarns that can be used.

For now we can donate usable clothes we no longer want to thrift stores. But wouldn't it be great if they could soon access this process..... for the old to be made new? Stay tuned. ~ shared with you by the Green Team.

FYI Thrift Again in Mankato will bail up some of the items for

shipment to Africa. And if you consider your items to be in the "rag" stage - MRCI and Salvation Army Thrift Store will accept them if in bags clearly marked.

A. Business Discussed

1. Pastor Report

- The Christmas Eve services were very well attended.
- There will be soup suppers for the Lent services, but not for Ash Wednesday. The WELCA group will take charge of the Lent soup suppers. The eighth graders will be involved in the Lenten services.
- Pastor suggested an Easter breakfast. It was discussed and tabled to be discussed at the Council/Committee retreat.
- Transitional Task Force (TTF) had a guest speaker and discussed conflict resolution.
- Pastor will walk Trinity through the steps in the Interim process he is following at the Annual meeting. Also, there will be a monthly coffee/fellowship time where Pastor can provide the congregation with updates and answer any questions about the Interim process as we move through this. The first Pastor information/coffee time will be Sunday February 11 at 9:00 am between services.

2. Treasurer's Report

The offerings as of December 31, 2023 were \$350,514. The total expenses through December 31, 2023 were \$326,177.

Offerings exceed expenses by \$24,337. The checking account balance as of December 31,

2023 is \$89,265.

3. Financial Update

- •Marc will do Temple Talk to review the proposed 2024 budget on January 14.
- •The proposed 2024 budget was discussed and approved. See Action Item 3.
- Information about a cemetery donation was reviewed. More information will need to be collected and reviewed before a decision can be made. A team needs to be assembled to study the information and make a recommendation

4. New Business

- •Lent Offerings It was suggested the Lenten offer ings be given a Ukrainian refugee that has moved to St. Peter. See Action Item 4.
- •Council/Committee Retreat This will be held Saturday, February 3 from 9:00 to noon at Trinity. This will involve all of the council and committee members to gather and exchange thoughts for the upcoming year. This will replace the normal monthly meeting for committees and council.

- •New Members There will be new members received on January 21 during the worship services.
- •The Kitchen The Kitchen has been operating again for the past 15 months. Attendance has grown and now serves about 80 people. They work with Second Harvest program and use the ServSafe guidelines.

5. Old Business

<u>Building Keys</u> – There are still some church building keys that have not been returned. Please do so at your earliest convenience. Reminder that the building is open for events that are on the church calendar. If there is need for other events/meeting, there is a 48 hour window needed for the custodian to accommodate special requests.

6. Committee Reports

<u>Property Committee</u>: The renter for the Miller house has moved in. Don will install the new water fountain in the narthex and has plans for the Audio Visual room in the <u>Sanctuary</u>: They will look into an elevator for the Sunday School wing to make it accessible.

Community Life: They will order corsages for the new members and have a reception. They plan to put to-gether Valentines kits.

<u>Children, Youth and Family</u>: They are ordering Bibles for Sunday School students. The Sunday School students will sing at the Palm Sunday service. They are looking ahead to Vacation Bible School and will do it inhouse with curriculum we currently have most likely in August in the evenings.

<u>Worship, Music and Arts</u>: New candles for altar have been ordered. The choir practices on Sunday mornings during the winter.

<u>Mission</u>: They reviewed projects they have completed in the past year and are planning ahead.

Adult Education: Book studies are planned for upcoming year.

<u>Stewardship</u>: They are brainstorming ideas for 2024. <u>Nominating</u>: The committee is meeting regularly and has made good progress.



Winter Crossword Puzzle





