



Volunteer Opportunity

The Kitchen is looking for volunteers to help provide a free meal for people in need on the first Monday of each month. Volunteer areas include cooking from approximately 3:30 - 5:30 depending on the menu, setup and serving from 5:00-6:30, and cleanup from 6:00-7:30 or any combination of the three. The Kitchen has now been serving meals for 18 months. For the first few weeks we served 25 to 28 guests with about 10 meals for volunteers. The numbers steadily increased over the next year. We are now cooking for 100 people and serving 70 to 100 meals to guests and 10-12 volunteers. This is back to pre-Covid number.

Five churches plan and serve meals on a rotating basis: Trinity Lutheran Church, Union Presbyterian Church, Church of St. Peter Catholic, First Lutheran Church and Scandian grove.

Our mission of serving people in need happens in many different ways including people in financial need of a meal, lonely people needing a social connection, and opportunities to volunteer and give back to the community.

The Kitchen is financially supported by donations from churches and other organization, funeral and special service donations and individual donations from those who come to meals, Food costs are kept down by preparing meals from scratch, participating with Second Harvest to obtain food at moderate to deep discounts, and bread product donations from Family Fresh and Mankato Hy-Vee. Over 60 people a month are volunteering in a variety of ways to make it possible to keep the Kitchen going.



From Your Interim Pastor

To Spring Ahead

Transitional Task Force focus now shifting.

There have been questions as of late as to why we have not started the call process, and I am hopeful to be able to answer some of these questions as we are now preparing to "spring ahead"!

In the past when there has been an interim pastor at Trinity Lutheran, the primary work of any "task force" that was formed has been to put together a Ministry Site Profile which is the step before a call committee is formed and ministry candidates are given to the call committee by the synod. The situation of my interim here has been different in that I came as the result of a situation where Trinity lost both your pastors within a few months of each other. When I arrived, it was the beginning of summer, and an immediate need was to attempt to bring people back to worship. In September, as a part of our Rally Day festivities, we were able to put together a task force that first needed to address some very important questions. These questions included - Whether Trinity would be calling one pastor or two; or the question about a youth director and the direction that would take us. These were complicated questions and needed the input from leadership. finance, and finally authorization from the congregation at the Annual Meeting. Please know that these were also questions that the synod felt were important to answer prior to the starting of the ministry site profile.

We are now ready to begin putting together our Ministry Site Profile which is the next step in calling a new pastor! We

would like as much input as possible from all members of the congregation as we develop our site profile. We will be setting up various opportunities throughout the months of March and April to meet with us and discuss any thoughts you may have. Additionally, we will be sending out a survey to complete. Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging

Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging Team's words from Sunday morning worship, February 11: You might be aware of some of the topics we've worked on - for instance, each Sunday the land acknowledgement for our building is contained in the Announcements, which helps us be aware of the painful history of forcing a people out of their homeland. We've discussed racism in our culture after watching an episode of the groundbreaking TV series of All in the Family. And at one of the very first events we hosted, we were in small groups and listened to each other share our backgrounds and how we first encountered awareness of racism. After each person finished, we repeated an Ubuntu greeting used in some African countries....

"We see you, We hear you, You Matter." Simple words but so meaningful.... to matter, to be seen, to be respected....to Belong.

So now this morning we are announcing a journey for our congregation as we explore stepping into being an intentional Welcoming church - which would say to our LGBTQ teens, young adults, adults, everyone - that they would truly be welcomed here. In our personal lives we all know these issues are a reality. We are all affected - these are people known to us in our jobs, in our neighborhoods - in our own families. We love and care for them. There is urgency around this work - because we know discrimination is alive and well.... but also we will not be hasty with this journey into radical Hospitality.

We want to have conversations. Please feel free to let one of us know you'd like to have a cup of coffee and talk - or one of us may call you and ask the same. There will also be some small group gatherings and educational opportunities. We invite you, all members of Trinity, to help us shape the journey as we listen to one another on this journey. The very first event for your calendar is Sunday, March 10, when Rev. Scott Richards of Gaylord, will be our guest preacher.

We ask for prayers and God's guidance on this journey.

A. Business Discussed

1. Pastor Report

Clean up of Christmas decorations from Advent. Boxing up and storing consumed much more time than actual set up. Resumption of confirmation for 2024. Confirmands will focus on the Apostles Creed. The time will be limited due to the early arrival of the season of Lent, with Ash Wednesday services beginning on February 14.

Monthly Interim meeting at the Synod office. (Both January and February on Zoom). Executive committee / council meeting / committee meetings.

Service night with the confirmands where they assisted in taking down the trees into the basement. Also a highlight of the upcoming Lenten season and duties of each confirmation class.

Conference pastors meeting at First Lutheran. February Conference Pastors' meeting on February 20 at Trinity Lutheran. The pastors will have noon lunch at the Coop, but we will need to provide an afternoon coffee / goodie break. There are two or three pastors that are gluten free folks so we will have to keep that in mind.

Preparation for a special Sunday of the Annual Meeting that included two services with H/C, a baptism between the services, a welcoming of new members and the Annual Meeting.

Regular sermon prep, office and computer work, several pa-

rishioners in to talk and beginning to put together the midweek Lenten services beginning with the Ash Wednesday service.

Preparation for Transitional Task Force that will meet at 5:30 PM on Sunday February with a new task of preparing the congregation for calling their new pastor.

Sermon prep for 1/7, 1/14, 1/21, 1/18. Prep for confirmation class on 1/3.

Computer work for professional reading, correspondence, letters and reports.

Daily correspondence and one to ones with office manager to confirm and plan weekly ministry events in addition to future planning.

2. Treasurer's Report

- Offerings as of January 31, 2024 were \$29,808.
- Total Expenses through January 31, 2024 were \$37,622.
- Expenses exceed offerings by \$7,814.
- Checking account balance as of January 31, 2024 is \$67,018.

3. Financial Update

- •There is an Endowment request to use funds to pay expenses for the Simpson Forum. This was discussed and a motion was made to approve the request of \$3,515 from the Simpson Endowment Fund. See Action Item 3.
- •A cemetery task force team will be put together to review the offer of a cemetery donation to discover what this would entail.
- •Bonus for Trinity's staff of 1.5% of their 2023 earnings, to thank them for their service. See Action Item 4.
- Suggested that Property Committee put together a task force to look into lift/elevator to provide access to the second floor of the education wing. This needs to be resolved by August.

4. Other Business/President's Report

- •Reflection of Pastor Dave's duties per the call agreement. Pastor Dave is leader of the staff and asks for support of Church Council.
- •Live Stream of the 10:00 service has been requested. The reporting of the music for contemporary services is in order. It is requested that Worship, Music and Arts Committee inform the broadcast team of this request.
- •Church Access The library representative would like Archives door to have a lock installed. Property can look into swapping handles with another door that no longer needs to be locked.
- •It is recommended to council for Property to rekey the exterior doors of the church. Motion to approve the exterior doors be fitted with new keys/locks. See Action Item 5.
- •Worship Service assistants the ushers, altar care and lay reader volunteers need to have an updated list of who is responsible for each week. This compiling of these lists falls under the responsibility of the Worship, Music and Arts committee.
- •Coffee Fellowship hosts it is requested that Community Life train volunteers and to update the list of volunteers for this.
- •Coffee with Pastor Dave will be held the second Sunday of each month to allow the congregation to visit, ask questions and to check in. This will begin March 11, since Pastor Dave will not be here February 11.

5. Nominating Report


