I admit my brain works in different ways sometimes, like noticing the similarities between the "Princess Bride" movie and the Bible. I can't say that I have always been an enthusiastic reader of the Bible. My initial beginnings resembled the grandson from the "Princess Bride". His grandpa offers to read him a story and the grandson asks if there are any sports in it. Grandpa assures him that there is fencing, fighting, torture, revenge, giants, monsters, chases, escapes, true love, and miracles. Trinity's Anniversary

Heritage and Archives: Did you know

On April 24, 1892, our church was founded as The First English Evangelical Lutheran congregation of St. Peter. "The Assistant" purchased for Pastor Sander for \$100 was a horse. Instead of receiving salaries the first few years, Pastor Sander and the other two preachers divided whatever was left of the collection money after other expenses were paid.

In 1896, the first organ was a regular reed pump organ. One morning the organist, failing to get any sound from the organ for the hymns, found that the two boys paid 10 cents a service to pump the organ had fallen asleep.

In 1914, a pipe organ was installed with a "vote of thanks to the Ladies Aid and to the Pipe Organ Committee.

In 1916, the congregation changed its constitution to permit women to vote in all church affairs, "a progressive step"!

In 1932, the original church building was enlarged, remodeled, and dedicated. The original wooden altar and pulpit went to a mission church in Markville, MN.

In 1936, the name of the congregation, First English Evangelical Church, was changed to Trinity Lutheran Church.

In 1939, the church steeple was removed.

On Palm Sunday, April 11, 1954, ground was broken for the Parish Hall/Education wing and was first used by the Sunday School on June 26, 1955, and dedicated on September 25, 1955.








How are you preparing yourself for a new celebration of Easter? Enjoy these Easter selections to help you prepare:







10. Committee Reports

Children, Youth and Family: The Christikon trip is going well. TLC will be doing Vacation Bible School together with First Lutheran this year. First Lutheran is doing a Lock-In on April 21 and invited the youth from TLC. Katherine Dunn and Larissa Gieseke-Nieves have taken the responsibility of leading the Sunday School program for the 2022-23 year without staff support and so the Council would like to provide each of them an Honorarium of \$150 each. Worship, Music and Arts: They have changed their committee meeting night to accommodate the members. The plants for the Easter Garden have been ordered. They have a dilemma about filling the candles for services.

<u>Mission</u>: They are collecting food and funds for the March Food Shelf project.

<u>Stewardship</u>: They are planning some kind of volunteer appreciation.


B. Responsibilities Assigned:

A. Business Discussed:

1. Pastor Joy's Report

- Pastoral care made all the home Communion visits and also Communion visits at the nursing home and assisted living facilities. It was great to see everyone and to hear their appreciation for my visits to them over the years. It was, as well, great for me to express my appreciation in getting to visit with them,
- Had been contacted by Jamie at Sand Prairie to lead Ash Wednesday devotion with Holy Communion. Despite the snowstorm, I led that service on Ash Wednesday.
- Home Communion list is up to date and will be handed over to Executive Committee. All but one (a member living in Mankato) of the people living independently has a TLC Companion.
- Will be meeting with Kay Mowbray and Bill Nelsen to gather details for the memorial services for Dale and Margie.
 This information for the printed order of service is needed much earlier than usual so that Kristen can enjoy the vacation days she has requested.
- Met with family of Leona Herberg to plan her memorial service. That service was held March 4.
- Met with Josh and Vlada Gladis to have conversation with them before Walter's baptism on March 5.
 - Thank you to Bob Broeder for offering the sermon on Sunday, March 5.
 - Thank you to Gretchen Bachman, Wendy and Marc Bachman, Nancy Sizer, Cary and Paul Albers, Al Behrends, Tim Kennedy, Jason Bexell, Lauryn Oberlander, Anders Dixon, Lily Deming and Keira Oeltjenbruns for participating in the Readers Theater at mid-week Lenten worship services.
 - I have selected Scripture readings for all the midweek Lenten worship services. I have also prepared and provided the order of service so that lay members can lead the services beginning March 15.
 - TLC's 5-8 grade confirmation students are meeting the Wednesdays of Lent following worship for small group conversations. I have prepared for them prompt questions based on the topic for each of the mid-week Lenten services.
 - Attended and tended to the Zoom meeting for each of the Thursday evening Simpson Forum sessions

- on Democracy and Christianity. The planning team created (another) wonderful learning event!
- The Committee-Council retreat this year on Feb 11 was led by the Executive Committee. I was glad they were able to use (and slightly adapt) questions I created for last year's retreat based on the Appreciative Inquiry process. It is a great process that draws out the very best of a system (like a congregation). You build on what is good and valued.
- Installation of all committee and council members was held the day after the retreat, on Feb 12. It was great to see so many elected leaders present and visible.
- Executive Committee will be made aware of these things regarding TLC's Confirmation program: 1) the schedule (dates and topic) of the 2023 spring classes; 2) the 2-year rotation of topics; 3) consideration is highly encouraged for something new for 5th grade students. It is too long of a day for them to be in school and then expected to be at confirmation until 8 pm on Wednesday evenings.
- Executive Committee will be made aware of scheduling
 First Communion classes for any youth interested and
 also options for the Blessing for the First Communion Sunday. Parents are to attend this instruction with their child.
 This Blessing in the worship service has happened either
 on Maundy Thursday or Palm Sunday since 2015.
- Executive Committee will be made aware of scheduling Baccalaureate service for the TLC high school seniors.
- Executive Committee will be made aware of scheduling new member orientation and a Sunday to formally receive new members. This has been done 2 times each year, shortly after Easter and on Reformation Sunday or All Saints Sunday. (A few years ago Affirmation of Baptism service was moved from early in May to Reformation Sunday so new member Sunday was moved to the following week.)
- I anticipate an exit interview will be scheduled on or before March 14.
- Thank you to one and all for all the ways you have served and will continue to serve in and beyond the walls of Trinity Lutheran Church. I have learned much from you and, of course, it is always a privilege to serve as a pastor of a congregation.

2. Treasurer's Report

- The offerings as of February 28, 2023 were \$49,476.65.
- The total expenses through February 28, 2023 were \$59.685.19.
- Expenses exceed offerings by \$10,208.54.
- The checking account balance as of February 28, 2023 is \$55,994.39.

3. Financial Report

 The rental houses passed city inspection. Marc is still researching what we would need to consider if we sell the rental houses and have them moved from the current location.

- The Trinity payroll is being done at Johnson & Hoehn and it is going well.
- Endowment Request to use \$2400 from the Simpson Forum Fund for the 2023 Simpson Forum. See Action Item 5.
- The Endowment Report for 2022 was reviewed. It was noted that there were funds left that could have been requested.
- The Rental houses were discussed and will be researched for future opportunities. See Action Item 6.

4. Pastor Heather Culuris / SWMN Synod

 Pr. Heather reviewed the process for the call process including the Mission Assessment, calling an Interim Pastor, creating a call committee and a congregational vote once a new pastor is located.

5. Personnel

- The Financial Support Specialist position is still posted
- The Building Supervisor position has a description and is posted.
- Youth Director position description is not firm at this time.

6. Council Appointments

- Names were brought forward by council members to fill vacancies on council and committees.
- Gretchen Bachman was nominated to be join the Personnel Committee for a 2-year term. See Action Item
- Carrie Albers was nominated to be a committee member for the Worship, Music & Arts Committee for a 2-year term. See Action Item 4.

7. Timeline in Narthex

 The timeline in the Narthex needs to be taken down and stored in Archives at this time. It was done for Trinity's 125 anniversary as a temporary presentation. There is discussion for plans to refresh the Narthex area in the near future as well. See Action Item 5.

8. Trauma Counseling

 Pastor Heather Culuris from the Synod provided dates for the suggested Trauma Counseling sessions on March 9 from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm and March 14 from 4:00 to 6:30 pm.

9. Worship & Sunday School Times

 After listening to discussion from the congregation about changing Sunday worship services back to 8:00 am and 9:30 am it was clear there is a preference to return to the previous times for worship with Sunday School students released after the children's sermon. See Action Item 6.
