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Executive Committee Report (in lieu of the Pastor's Report) Over the next year, as we bring in Pastor Dr. Dave Christenson to serve as our Interim Minister, it is an important time for us, the congregation of Trinity, to renew our understanding of our Purpose to carry on the "Faith of our Founders (it's 2023) in the Language of our Children."

The role of Trinity's Congregational Council is to have general oversight of the life and activities of this congregation, and in particular its worship life, to the end that everything be done in accordance with the Word of God and the faith and practice of the ELCA. These are the guidelines set up in Trinity's Constitution. The Mission of the members of our congregation, to paraphrase our Constitution, is to nurture our members in the Word of God so as to grow in faith and hope and love, to see daily life as the primary setting for the exercise of our Christian calling and to use the gifts of the Spirit for our life together for our calling in the world. To fulfill these purposes we are called to provide services of worship at which the Word of God is preached, provide pastoral care to all of our members, challenge, equip and support all generations of our members with tools to carry out our calling in our daily lives and witness by reaching out to all people.

Twelve years ago or so Trinity looked to make a shift in the leadership of our congregation. We were fortunate to bring in a strong leader as Pastor, have several full-time staff and over several years create the full-time position of Church Administrator. That structure brought us a decade of stability. Over the decade many of the roles previously completed by the congregation were managed by our multiple full-time staff.

Much like society, the Lutheran Church and Trinity has changed in the last few years and our financial ability to support multiple

full-time leadership staff has also. While we could view our current situation as troubling or frustrating, when we review the Mission of Trinity and what we as members of the congregation are called to provide for ourselves, our children and all people, this is an exciting opportunity for each of us.

Now is our opportunity to take on on leadership and supporting roles as the council plans and prepares for Rally Sunday in September and ensures our ability to support our Mission remains as strong as ever.

The Church Council has been overjoyed to see our members already take action by immediately stepping up to support the needs of the 8:00 a.m. worship service when it returned.

Many hands make light work. This is Glorious work in the name of our Father. There are and will be many roles for each of us to fill using the gifts we have been blessed with as we continue to Gather to worship, Grow in faith and Go in service.

The Personnel Committee has been working very hard these past few months and we are pleased to welcome 3 new members to the Trinity Team. Don Carlson is the new Building Supervisor, Josie Lust is the new Financial Supervisor, and Paul Matzke has been hired to serve as Choir Director beginning next fall. 



Church Council Meeting Minutes - April 11, 2023

A. Business Discussed:

1. Staff Report

- Marc Bachman has been sitting in on the Wednesday staff meetings since the end of Pastor Joy's tenure. Marc submits this report.
- The transition back to 2 Sunday services has been positive.
 Many thanks to Kristen, Judy and Annette for their assistance in making the transition smooth.
- Services are based on the liturgy prepared by Sundays and Seasons, which Kristen has made sure is ready each week. All the music for the spring was prepared previously by Judy and members of the worship committee. The music, other than the post Sermon hymn, are set through May.
- It is recommended we create a checklist to be followed to lock up the building at the end of evening events and that the church run through the process with anyone locking up prior to the event.
- Services for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.
- All committees are asked to be available to provide support on Easter Sunday.
- A group is needed to strip the altar after Maunday Thursday service
- All services will be live streamed.
- Worship committee will be sure any necessary parament changes are made.
 - Staff supports Baccalaureate service being within a Sunday service rather than a stand alone service.
 - An announcement will be placed in the Easter announcement page regarding First Communion.
 - Staff will meet with the funeral home to create a funeral checklist. There are services which are being duplicated and services often completed by the funeral home.
 - The funeral home should have a name to contact during the funeral. Generally they just ask the kitchen staff.
 - Name tags if Trinity volunteers during funerals would make sense.
 - The calendar on the website and Facebook are wrong. Apparently changing the time of the service would mean repopulating the workers and other details in the program.
 - Kristen is contacting the Pulpit Support each Monday to gather their readings and Sermon Hymn.
 - Judy Schultz would like the land recognition state-

- ment to be included in the bulletin. My response was that we will wait until an Interim Pastor is on duty to provide input.
- Church hours from Memorial Day to Labor Day are 8:30 am – 3:00 pm.
- Staff have appreciated how committees have taken ownership of their committees and events.
- The choir director position should be posted and interviews held in April.
- This isn't from staff a reception recognizing Annette's 34 years of service will need to take place prior to May 14.
- Recommend Facebook be open to each committee chair to post happenings and announcements.
- Some type of announcement review should take place.
- Would also require a Facebook posting statement.
- Pastor Joy had shared that Confirmation plans would be shared. Who has those plans and are we going to engage with the confirmation students in Sundays and after Easter?
- It is becoming apparent that a monthly meeting should be set for our non-paid volunteers who play weekly roles within the church. (Kitchen, Quilters, Video, Sunday School, Confirmation, Soup Supper)
- The key pad is functional. Marc will work to get codes set up during April.

2. Treasurer's Report

- The offerings as of March 31, 2023 were \$74,511
- The total expenses through March 31, 2023 were \$86,220
- Expenses exceed offerings by \$11,709
- The checking account balance as of March 31, 2023 is \$53,175
- Note: Offerings were up slightly in March (\$23,543) over February (\$22,260), but still below March 2022 (\$25,893)

3. Financial Update

- The Library Committee has requested a paper cutter since the ones Trinity currently has do not work for their purposes. This was discussed and agreed to as it will come out of their Endowment fund.
- A van for the Christikon trip has been reserved.
- Last month the council approved the changes to our church insurance. As a part of that Trinity will need to complete a survey regarding our procedures related to preventing sexual misconduct. Much of this information will apply to our hiring processes and annual reviews. I assume we will need to meet with Personnel to review our practices.
- Marc has spoken to another party interested in purchasing the two houses owned by Trinity. Nothing is imminent but the investigation continues.
- Carolyn will be sending out the first quarter giving reports.
 It was decided that Trinity will send out the first quarter
 each year via mail (after setting them in the narthex for a
 few weeks to reduce postage expenses) with a request to
 please call the office if members prefer a mailed report the
 remainder of the year. All other quarterly reports would be

sent via Breeze.

4. d.e.i.B (diversity, equity, inclusion, Belonging Committee)

- d.e.i.B Committee shared experiences that drew them to this group and the work they are doing.
- They explained the steps that would need to be taken to become a congregation that is Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Partner. This is a process that would take time as Trinity works through the steps. They are requesting funds for the RIC training program. Council will discuss this further.

5. Personnel

- The Financial Support Specialist position has been posted.
- The Building Supervisor position has been filled by Don Carlson and he will begin on April 19.
- Youth Director position description is not firm at this time.

6. Council Appointments

- Names were brought forward by council members to fill vacancies on council and committees.
- Jamie Seitzer was nominated to join the Finance Committee for a 2-year term. See Action Item 3.
- Mari Feder was nominated to be a committee member for the Worship, Music & Arts Committee for a 2year term. See Action Item 4.

7. Narthex Refresh

- There will need to be a small team to meet 2 to 3 times to come up with some inspiration to enliven our Narthex area. The Miller Study had suggested making it a more welcoming space for new people and members.
- There are funds of \$1,000 from the receipts from Family Fresh available to use towards this. Stewardship will see about a ballot or vote with options for members to decide how to use the funds.

8. Committee Reports

- Property Committee: Met with Don Carlson as candidate for Building Supervisor. They will be looking at potential future duties that may be added to the Building Supervisor position.
- Community Life: They will be packing goodie bags for the graduates. Plans are ongoing for Annette's retirement celebration on May 21. We are looking forward to a potluck to welcome Pastor Dave in June.
- Children, Youth and Family: The Christikon trip fund raiser went well. Funds needed for Christikon are estimated at \$5,500. It was suggested they put their updates in the Trinity newsletter. They will be doing a pizza party to celebrate the end of the confirmation year.
